You are eligible to obtain a Computer Sciences (CS) Certificate if you are either (1) enrolled in a bachelor's degree program at UW-Madison, and you are not in the Law School, and you are not majoring in CS, Electrical Engineering (EE), or Computer Engineering (CE); or (2) you are a Special Student at UW-Madison who has already earned a bachelor's degree in a major other than CS, EE or CE.

To earn a CS Certificate, a student must complete 6 CS courses, each worth at least 2 credits, and each with a minimum grade of C, including the following:

- CS 302 and CS 367 (or equivalent transfer or AP credits)
- at most 4 courses below the 400 level
- at least 2 courses at the 400 level or above
- for students currently enrolled in a bachelor's degree program at UW-Madison: at least 50% of the credits must be in residence at UW-Madison; for Special Students: at least 12 of the credits must be earned in residence at UW-Madison, either while enrolled as a University Special student or from undergraduate course work at UW-Madison; in both cases, non-graded (S/U) courses taken in residence cannot be used

Completing just CS 367 counts as completing both CS 302 and CS 367 (and in that case, only 5 courses total are required).

The following courses may *not* be used for the CS Certificate: CS 250, CS 298, CS 304, CS 368, CS 371, CS 402, CS 550, CS 699 and CS 915. CS 638 may be used only if it has been approved for use towards the CS Major.
